Mr. Sledzinski recommended approving the two year premium at a total cost of \$104,952 for two years. The next item was **boat well** vacancies. There are 237 boat wells in the marina and currently 130 are reserved for summer. The greatest occupancy is comprised of 25′-28′ boats. The Recreation Supervisor provided an overview. The smaller wells house trailerable boats and therefore they comprise the majority of the vacancies. The Director of Public Services stated that the canal does not accommodate larger boats, which require a greater turning ratio. Discussion ensued regarding adjusting the orientation of the wells, which would incur major expense to remove pilings. There was a suggestion to obtain a professional assessment from a third party. There was also a suggestion to reduce the rates for 25′ and under wells. The Director of Public Services and the City Administrator/Assessor recommended dropping the rates for next season. Administration was asked to find out if placing floating docks within one well is feasible. There was a consensus of the committee to lower the rate for smaller docks. Administration was

asked to provide vacancy percentages from the other Grosse Pointes. Administration was asked to provide vacancy percentages from the other Grosse Pointes.

This item is to remain on the Committee-of-the-Whole agenda.

Hearing no objections, the following items were discussed under New Business:

- The Treasurer/Comptroller stated her part-time accountant will soon be going on maternity leave. She requested permission to publish for a temporary staff person to cover the maternity leave period at a rate of \$24-27 per hour. There was a consensus of the Committee to permit her to move forward with the temporary replacement.
- The Mayor suggested an assessment of the cost to identify and replace all lead water service lines, both the City's and the property owner's. The Treasurer/Comptroller stated it would be a suitable charge to the water/sewer fund as long as the work would be City-wide. The Director of Public Services stated an inspection from the inside of the house will identify materials. Administration was asked to find out why copper piping was used at the Rivers and on other new construction. Administration is to provide Council with corrosive test results. There was a consensus of the Committee to find out the cost of identifying and replacing lead leads.

 Jennifer Miller, 2160 Hampton, discussed various breeds of dogs, which breeds that can be vicious and are not included in the ordinance, and that her dog is a Staffordshire Bull Terrier and not a pit bull.

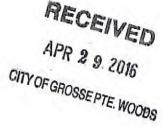

Subject: Proposed 2016-2017 Budget



Pursuant to Section 8.2 of the City Charter, we hereby present the proposed budget for fiscal year 2016-2017. The Finance Committee and Committee of the Whole met to discuss the proposed budget on January 4 and 11, February 8 and 29, March 14, 21 and 28, and April 4 and 18, 2016.

As a result of those meetings, the budget was prepared with the City's general operating millage rate at 13.8158 and the use of \$170,000 General Fund Fund balance. The general operating millage is at the Headlee Cap. The total City millage rate, inclusive of Public Relations, Solid Waste and Road Bond Debt is 17.4176. Attached is a summary of the total budget and fund balance forecast.

At a Committee of the Whole meeting held on April 11, 2016, the water/sewer budget and rate schedule was discussed at length. The Committee of the Whole recommends a rate increase of 3.8% which is the expected increase for an average residential customer. This rate increase, effective July 1, 2016, reflects pass thru costs from Detroit.

AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF FONTBONNE AUXILIARY OF ST. JOHN HOSPITAL AND MEDICAL CENTER

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this Corporation shall be the Fontbonne Auxiliary of St. John Hospital and Medical Center.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

The philosophy of the Corporation is that of the Congregation of St. Joseph of Nazareth and the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul ("Sponsors") as articulated and promoted through statements of Mission, Vision and Values of the Corporation in accordance with the official teachings of the Roman Catholic Church and the Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholic Health Care Services as approved and promulgated, from time to time, by the National Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Corporation's purposes shall be consistent with and supportive of the corporate purposes of St. John Hospital and Medical Center and the Sponsors.

The mission of the Corporation is as follows:

Section I To act as an auxiliary to St. John Hospital and Medical Center and as such to provide financial and other assistance to St. John Hospital and Medical Center and to the Congregation of Saint Joseph, Nazareth, Michigan, one of the Sponsors.

Section II To receive contributions and pay them over to St. John Hospital and Medical Center and the Congregation of St. Joseph of Nazareth, one of the Sponsors, both of which are organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and are exempt from taxation under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, while such entities are so exempt.

Section III The Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for purposes stated in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as heretofore or hereafter amended.

<u>Section IV</u> In general, to carry on any activities in connection with and incidental to the foregoing purposes not forbidden by the laws of the State of Michigan and consistent with the charitable purposes set forth above.

otherwise provided by these bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation, the laws of the State of Michigan, or the Bylaws of St. John Hospital and Medical Center.

ARTICLE VI BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section I The business of the Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors which shall exercise all powers of the Corporation not reserved or conferred upon the members of the Fontbonne Auxiliary, by the laws of the State of Michigan, the Articles of Incorporation or these bylaws.

Section II The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than fifteen (15) nor more than twenty nine (29) members. The officers shall be the President, the President Elect, the Vice-President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary and other assistant positions as needed, who shall serve on the Board. The remaining members of the Board shall be elected from the membership of the Corporation. The President of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph or her designated representative will be invited to attend meetings as our Spiritual Advisor and will be a non-voting member. The President of St. John Hospital and Medical Center or his or her designated representative shall be invited to give an administrative report at the Board meetings and shall not have a vote.

Section III Members of the Board of Directors shall be selected by the Nominating Committee of the Corporation and elected by the membership at the February General Membership Meeting and installed at the May annual meeting of the Corporation in the odd numbered years to hold office for two (2) years and until their successors are elected or until they resign.

Section IV Service on the Board of Directors is limited to four (4) successive terms of office. This term limitation shall not apply to an individual serving as a Board member due to her status as either the President-Elect or President. A person who has served four (4) consecutive terms as a Director may not be again elected as a Director for one full term. Partial terms served as a result of mid-term appointments to the Board shall not count as a full term for the above purposes.

Section V Any Director may be removed from office at any time by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting. Any Director may resign at any time by delivering a written resignation to the President. Vacancies on the Board due to death, disability, resignation, removal or other causes may be filled by appointment by the Board, upon recommendation of the Nominating Committee.

Section VI On a yearly basis, all Directors must attend at least two (2) Board meetings, at least one (1) general membership meeting and support at least one (1) fundraiser. Failure to meet these minimum standards without an excused absence will be deemed a resignation. For these purposes, "yearly basis" is defined as the period

The Executive Committee shall meet as needed, shall keep minutes of its meetings and shall report its actions at every meeting of the Board of Directors or as often as may be required by that Board.

Section II The Executive Committee shall consist of not less than six (6) nor more than twelve (12) members. The Executive Committee shall consist of President, President-Elect, Vice-President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary, plus up to six other voting Directors who are appointed by the President and shall have served on the Board of Directors for at least one (1) year.

<u>Section III</u> The President of Fontbonne Auxiliary shall serve as Chairman of the Executive Committee.

<u>Section IV</u> The members of the Executive Committee shall serve a two (2) year term of office to coincide with their term on the Board.

Section V The Executive Committee shall meet on a call of the President at such date, time and location as selected by the President. At least three (3) days notice shall be given for such meetings when possible.

Section VI A majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum and the vote of the majority of the members present shall be the action of the Executive Committee.

Section VII The Executive Committee shall appoint the three additional members of the Nominating Committee which shall include two (2) members from the Board of Directors and one (1) person from the general membership.

ARTICLE IX NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Section I The Nominating Committee shall consist of five (5) members: the President-Elect, four members appointed by the Executive Committee pursuant to Article VIII, Section VII, two of which needs to be a member at large. The Executive Committee shall select the chair of the Nominating Committee, not to include the President-Elect.

Section II It shall be the duty of the Nominating Committee to prepare a slate of officers including a President, President-Elect, Vice-President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary in accordance with Article XIII Section I. In addition, the Nominating Committee shall prepare a slate of nominees for the Board of Directors. The Nominating Committee shall inform the Board of Directors of such nominations for information purposes only. The Board of Directors shall have no power to approve or alter these nominations.

ARTICLE XIII OFFICERS

Section I The members of the Corporation shall elect a President, President-Elect, Vice-President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary from a slate of nominees prepared by the Nominating Committee pursuant to Article IX, Section II. Officers shall be elected for a two-year term of office. The President, President-Elect, Vice-President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary may not succeed themselves in office. The slate of officers and board members will be presented and voted upon at the general meeting directly preceding the annual meeting at which they will be installed. The regular term of office of all the officers shall commence at the adjournment of the annual meeting at which they are installed.

ARTICLE XIV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section I The President shall have such powers and duties as are vested in the President of a non-profit corporation by law or custom and as may be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors except as otherwise provided by these bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation and the laws of the State of Michigan. The President shall be the presiding officer at all meetings of the Auxiliary, the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee and shall appoint and be an ex-officio member on all committees except as otherwise provided in these bylaws. The President shall also be responsible for coordinating the activities of the Auxiliary.

Section II The Vice President shall, in the absence or disability of the President, perform the duties of the President and shall perform such other duties as the President or the Board of Directors may prescribe.

<u>Section III</u> The President Elect shall, in the absence or disability of the President and Vice President, perform the duties of the President and shall perform such other duties as the President or the Board of Directors may prescribe.

<u>Section IV</u> The Recording Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the Auxiliary, its Board of Directors and Executive Committee and shall perform such duties as the President or the Board of Directors may prescribe.

Section V The Corresponding Secretary shall perform such duties as the President or the Board of Directors may prescribe.

<u>Section VI</u> The Treasurer shall perform such duties as the President or the Board of Directors may prescribe.

ARTICLE XVIII INDEMNIFICATION

The Fontbonne Auxiliary shall provide for the indemnification of each member of the Board of Directors, officers at any time in office and voluntary Committee Chairs against expenses actually and necessarily incurred by them in connection with the defense of any action suit or proceeding in which they or any of them are made parties, or a party, by reason of being, or having been, members of the Board of Directors, officers or voluntary Committee Chairs of the Auxiliary, except in relation to matters as to which any such Directors, officers or voluntary Committee Chairs shall be adjudged in any action suit or proceeding to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of duty and to such matters as shall be settled by agreement predicated on the existence of such liability. The foregoing right of indemnification shall not preclude any indemnification of any such Director, officer or voluntary Committee Chairs or other person acting for or in the interests of the Auxiliary to which such director, officer, voluntary Committee Chair or other person acting for or in the interests of the Auxiliary may be entitled by law or by virtue of any document or agreement or which may be legally provided or afforded by or under any action by the members and/or directors of the Auxiliary. All rights of indemnification shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of the person involved.

ARTICLE XIX AMENDMENTS

Section I The bylaws of the Fontbonne Auxiliary may be amended upon approval by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members in good standing present at any regular or special meeting of the membership providing that notice of such intent to amend these bylaws is included in the notice of the meeting pursuant to these bylaws. The bylaws' committee shall inform the Board of Directors of such bylaw amendments for information purposes only.

<u>Section II</u> Every two years, the President shall establish a committee for the purpose of considering the continued appropriateness and functional adequacy of these bylaws, and possible amendments thereto made necessary or desirable by reason of developments affecting the internal administration of the Corporation.

ARTICLE XX HOSPITAL RELATIONSHIP

The Board of Trustees of St. John Hospital and Medical Center is authorized to represent the interests of the Hospital. As such, the Fontbonne Auxiliary's bylaws, regulations, policies, procedures, programs and projects are subject to approval by the Hospital's Board of Trustees to such extent as the Board of Trustees may deem appropriate. Further, the Board of Trustees of the Hospital may require of the Auxiliary financial and other reports to be conveyed to the Trustees by the President of the Auxiliary. Any changes affecting the Fontbonne Auxiliary must be presented to the

These bylaws and amendments thereto shall become effective following the approval by the Fontbonne Board of Directors, the general membership of the Fontbonne Auxiliary and the Board of Trustees of St. John Hospital and Medical Center.
